### **Fall Safety Tips**

As the days grow shorter, proper lighting becomes essential for maintaining a secure environment. Ensure that all exterior lights are functioning, including pathway lights, and entrance lighting. Well-lit areas act as a deterrent for potential trespassers and enhance visibility for your tenants and visitors, minimizing the risk of accidents. Consider carrying a small flashlight on your person for times when you must walk in dark areas. Fallen leaves and overgrown landscaping can obscure visibility and create hiding spots for unwanted intruders. Regularly schedule landscaping and maintenance services to keep your property's surroundings clean and well-kept. Trim shrubs, rake leaves, and ensure that all pathways and entrances are free of obstacles. Wet leaves also create a hazard in the fall by making sidewalks slippery. Later in the season, snow may mix with leaves to increase the risk of falling. Ensure your property is kept free of fallen leaves to prevent hazards at your residents. A well-maintained property not only enhances curb appeal but also discourages criminal activity.
